



FIFTH GRADE CURRICULUM

IN FIFTH GRADE GRAMMAR & COMPOSITION our students will:

- write three types of essays: informative, narrative, and persuasive
- learn basic grammatical elements of a sentence by sentence diagramming
- study Latin and Greek roots and their English derivatives (“English from the Roots Up”)
- learn the basics of composition: introduction, lines of argument, and conclusion

IN FIFTH GRADE LITERATURE our students will read and discuss:

- novels such as Tom Sawyer, The Secret Garden, and The Wind in the Willows
- stories from Frederick Douglass, Sherlock Holmes, and Tales from Shakespeare
- Poems such as “O Captain! My Captain!” by Whitman and “The Tyger” by Blake
- Myths and legends such as The Samurai’s Daughter and The Sun Dance

IN FIFTH GRADE HISTORY & GEOGRAPHY our students will:

- memorize and identify the Great Lakes of the World
- study the Renaissance, Reformation, Counter-Reformation, and English history
- study the early growth and expansion of Russia and related geography
- study the history and culture of feudal Japan and related geography
- study the history of antebellum America, the Civil War, and westward expansion

IN FIFTH GRADE MATH our students will:

- add, subtract, multiply, and divide fractions
- find the area of triangle and the volume of cuboids
- understand and apply the order of operations to mathematical problems
- analyze data using coordinate graphs and straight line graphs

IN FIFTH GRADE SCIENCE our students will:

- classify living things by kingdom, phylum, class, order, family, genus, and species
- study the structures and processes of cells in both plants and animals
- examine the asexual reproductive processes of fission, spores, budding, etc.
- study the human endocrine system, including the types of glands and their functions

IN FIFTH GRADE ART our students will:

- study the major works of art from the Italian and Flemish Renaissance
- become familiar with Renaissance architecture such as the Florence cathedral, etc.
- draw, paint, and sketch perspectives using a horizon line and vanishing point

IN FIFTH GRADE MUSIC our students will:

- take rhythm dictations and write their own original rhythm using standard notation
- listen to instrumental and choral music of the Renaissance era
- sing the fifth grade repertoire including God Bless America, Greensleeves, Dona Nobis Pace
