#### **Washington's Winter Break**

Please note that school will not be in session on Friday, February 17 and Monday, February 20, in honor of Presidents' Day. Although the holiday is now most often referred to as Presidents' Day, the observed federal holiday is officially called "Washington's Birthday." Historically, Americans began celebrating George Washington's Birthday just months after his death, long before Congress declared the day as a federal holiday. It was not until 1879, under President Rutherford B. Hayes, that Washington's Birthday became a legal holiday, to be observed on his birthday, February 22. Since 1968, the federal holiday was moved to the closest Monday.

### Re-Enrollment for 2023-24

Re-enrollment for the 2023-24 school year for all current students is open until February 28. We guarantee spots for the 2023-24 school year for all students who are currently enrolled at Cincinnati Classical Academy, provided that the student remains in good academic and disciplinary standing and that re-enrollment is confirmed by February 28. The re-enrollment process of your current CLASSICAL student(s) consists of logging into your <a href="Schoolmint Dashboard">Schoolmint Dashboard</a>, clicking on "ADD A FORM" for each current student, then filling in the re-enrollment information that is listed. Please note that registration for NEW students is now also open until February 28.
