Public Community Schools: What is the difference?

Public Schools	Public Community Schools	Nonpublic/Private Schools
<p>Funded entirely through State and Federal funds, Ohio's base amount of \$7350 plus additional revenue from LOCAL taxation.</p> <p>All districts supplement this base amount by asking the voters to approve additional taxes and Federal programs.</p>	<p>Funded at Ohio's base amount of \$7350; Receives NO Local tax revenue.</p> <p>Any supplemental funding is raised privately, typically through events and donations.</p> 	<p>Funded privately, typically through tuition and donations.</p>
<p>Must use curriculum developed by the State Board of Education of Ohio and Ohio Department of Education.</p>	<p>Have more freedom to control curriculum, and in choosing their mission and model of education.</p> 	<p>Have more freedom to control curriculum, and in choosing their mission and model of education; may choose to offer a religious-based curriculum.</p>
<p>Are overseen and administered by the State of Ohio Department of Education and local school boards.</p>	<p>Operate independently from local school districts, yet have an authorized sponsoring entity that ensures the school's compliance with state law and administrative rules</p> 	<p>Are independent but follow the Operating Standards for Ohio Schools</p>
