Public Community Schools: What is the difference?

Public Schools	Public Community Schools	Nonpublic/Private Schools
Funded entirely through State and Federal funds, Ohio's base amount of \$7350 <b>plus</b> additional revenue from LOCAL taxation. All districts supplement this base amount by asking the <b>voters</b> to approve additional taxes and Federal programs.	Funded at Ohio's base amount of \$7350; Receives <i>NO Local tax revenue</i> . Any supplemental funding is raised privately, typically through events and donations.	Funded privately, typically through tuition and donations.
Must use curriculum developed by the State Board of Education of Ohio and Ohio Department of Education.	Have more freedom to control curriculum, and in choosing their mission and model of education.	Have more freedom to control curriculum, and in choosing their mission and model of education; may choose to offer a religious-based curriculum.
Are overseen and administered by the State of Ohio Department of Education and local school boards.	Operate independently from local school districts, yet have an authorized sponsoring entity that ensures the school's compliance with state law and administrative rules	Are independent but follow the Operating Standards for Ohio Schools
