Beginning this fall, we will be implementing a class-switching system for students in grades 5-7. This means that your child will have the opportunity to experience several different classrooms and teachers throughout the school day. One way to look at the middle school schedule is as a hybrid between the self-contained classroom format of K-4 and the departmentalization of classes in high school. We understand that change can sometimes be challenging for students, and we want to assure you that we are carefully planning this transition. Our teachers and school leaders will provide the necessary support and guidance to ensure a smooth adjustment for middle school students to the new schedule, routines, and procedures. We have scheduled a middle school parent information session for the evening of August 24 at 7 PM in the Sojourner Truth Auditorium to provide detailed explanations, address any queries, and offer insights into the benefits of this approach to the middle school grades.

Kindergarten Readiness Assessment

Kindergarten students will begin their school year on Tuesday, September 5, one week after grades 1-7 begin school. This staggered start allows us to create a nurturing and supportive environment for our youngest learners as they transition into formal education. During the first week of school (Aug. 29-Sept. 1), kindergarten parents will be asked to schedule an appointment to bring in their child for the Kindergarten Readiness Assessment (KRA). The KRA is designed to evaluate various aspects of readiness for kindergarten, including social, cognitive, and physical development. It helps us gain valuable insights into each child's strengths and areas where additional support may be beneficial. We understand that starting school can be an exciting yet apprehensive time for both parents and kindergarteners. To ensure that all parents are well-informed and prepared for their child's first days at school, we will be sending out an orientation letter in early August. This letter will provide detailed information about the Kindergarten Readiness Assessment process, as well as other essential details about the start of the school year, including teacher homeroom assignments.

A Note on Gym Uniforms

We would like to clarify the uniform requirements for Physical Education classes. Students in grades 3-7 will be changing for gym class and are required to have the CLASSICAL gym uniform. This uniform ensures uniformity and promotes a sense of unity among our students during physical activities. Students in these grades should come prepared with their gym uniform each day and will be required to change into it before the start of the class. Please note that this requirement does not apply to students in kindergarten, first, and second grade. They will not be changing for P.E. classes, and they are not required to have the gym uniform.

The 2023-2024 School year will have the implementation of a fee of \$95 per student. The student fee will be allocated towards the purchase of curriculum consumables and new curriculum texts. By implementing this fee, we can ensure that our students have access to up-to-date and comprehensive resources that enhance their learning and support their academic growth. We understand the importance of responsible financial management and are committed to using these funds judiciously to benefit our students directly.

The Student Book Fee can be paid directly through your Final Forms account (FinalForms.com). To the left of your students name you will see \$ sign. Click on that sign and your Student Book Fee will appear. You can pay it directly online with a credit card. Once the payment is completed your dollar sign will change from RED to GREEN. If you prefer not to make payment online, you may bring or mail a check or money order into the school office. Please mark the envelope "Student Book Fee". On the check or money order please place a post it with have your child(ren) name and grade for the 2023-2024 school year. Summer Office hours are 8am-12pm. The office will be closed July 3 – July 7, 2023.

Beginning May 31, 2023, you can begin completing your Student's Final Forms. Please refer to your account. Most of the forms remain the same as 2022-2023 school year, but we have added a few new ones; so, please be diligent when reviewing. Please note these three points.

- All information currently in FinalForms will rollover to the 2023-2024 year but please review each section in case there is missing information. All forms will need an updated electronic signature and date. All Forms will be RED until completed. Once completed the form will turn GREEN.
- We ask that you complete and sign the first form Contact Information by the end of the day, May 31, as well as uploading a current Proof of Residency. The remainder can be filled in throughout the summer with the deadline of **Monday**, **July 17**, **2023**.
- Fall Sports (Girls Volleyball Grades 3-7 and Co-ed Cross Country Grades 5-7) will have open registration starting June 12. You can do this through Final Forms. A reminder, once you sign up for a sport, additional paperwork will be required in your Final Forms.
