Classical education is highly interactive and requires consistent and punctual attendance. Because the classical approach relies heavily on classroom discussion among students and teachers, most work done in class cannot be made up if a student is absent. For this reason, parents should exercise prudence and make every reasonable effort to ensure that students do not miss class, including restricting family trips to the allotted school holidays and vacation weeks. The first week of the school year is particularly important for students. Students who take family vacations during school days, including during the first week of school, will be marked as having unexcused absences for the days missed. Unexcused absences will negatively affect the student's academic progress and academic standing; they may lead to a decline in their overall academic performance.
