First Day of School – August 29

We eagerly anticipate the beginning of the 2023-24 school year and the return of our students. For grades 1-7, the first day of school is scheduled for Tuesday, August 29. We kindly request that students arrive at school between 7:30 and 8:10 AM each morning. To facilitate a smooth start to the day, we have designated the Blue Awning Entrance as the drop-off point, which is the same as last year. This area operates with a single-line drop-off system, ensuring efficient traffic flow. Please note that the traffic runs in a counter-clockwise one-way direction around the school building. For students who arrive prior to 7:50 AM, they will be directed to the Cincinnatus Refectory. At 7:50 AM, they will be released to their respective classrooms. School starts promptly at 8:15 AM each day.

Afternoon Pick-Up Procedures

Upon your arrival by car, a staff member will welcome you and record your family name, along with the names of any individuals you are picking up. We kindly request your cooperation in adhering to the directions provided by our traffic sentinels, as safety remains our top priority.
