Please note that students may wear the winter uniform any time of the school year, including this month as we see dropping temperatures. Until Nov. 1, wearing the summer uniform is still an option. However, on November 1 (the first day of the second quarter), the winter uniform will be mandatory until the first day of the fourth quarter.

April 8 – No School. Total Solar Eclipse

On Monday, April 8, 2024, people within a 124-mile-wide band in the state of Ohio will experience a total solar eclipse. That means that during the middle of the day, the sun will be totally eclipsed and the sky will go dark. The last total solar eclipse visible in Ohio was in 1806. And the next total solar eclipse in Ohio will be in the year 2099, when most of our students will be in their eighties. Because this is such a rare event, we have decided to that we will have a day off of school on April 8 so that students and families can travel to a place nearby where you can experience the total eclipse. If you live in West Chester or Liberty Township you won't have to go anywhere, because you'll be directly in the band of total darkness. Of course you'll hear plenty more about this in the coming months.

ALL are invited to sign the Pledge, including those with small children who are not yet asking for smart phones as well as those with older children who already use these technologies. The overarching goal of the Pledge is to create a community of families who support a lower-tech environment in the home and our hope is to navigate these questions together. We hope to grow in community among CLASSICAL families and help each other to anchor firmly in the home all of the richness our children receive through their school experience.
