As we continue on our "sentinel odyssey" in search of a permanent K-12 facility, I would like to provide you with an update on the recent developments regarding Cincinnati Classical Academy's application for re-zoning in Miami Township. In a special meeting held on November 9, the Miami Township Trustees considered the school's application to re-zone a parcel at 6285-6287 Tri-Ridge Blvd to allow for educational use. Regrettably, the zoning change was denied in a unanimous 3-0 vote by the trustees. The decision followed nine months of extensive preparatory work by our Board of Directors, including the development of a lease-with-purchase-option agreement, site and remodeling plans, technical studies, and means for tax-exempt bond financing.. Email Communications in the Life of a Teacher

We would like to bring to your attention the extraordinary demands our middle school teachers are currently facing in terms of their workload, specifically concerning email communications. Each middle school teacher is responsible for approximately 125 students daily, with dedicated duties from 7:45 AM to 3:45 PM, including six hours of direct teaching. In addition to their regular hours, most teachers spend an extra hour or two each afternoon or evening preparing for classes. At CLASSICAL, our teachers prioritize teaching during class time rather than reading emails or surfing the internet. While we value communication with parents and understand the importance of responding

within 48 hours, it is crucial to recognize that our teachers are primarily hired for the duty of teaching. Responding to emails can be time-consuming and, unfortunately, takes away from the planning and teaching hours that directly impact your child's education. We believe in maintaining a culture focused on teaching and students, avoiding unnecessary distractions that may arise from an excessive reliance on push-button technology. We simply ask that you be mindful of their time. We appreciate your understanding and cooperation in this matter. Your continued support allows our teachers to dedicate their time and energy to what they do best – educating and nurturing our students.

Winter Uniform Clarifications

During quarters 2 and 3, boys in grades 5-7 must wear the white oxford with logo (short-sleeve or long-sleeve) with the Hamilton plaid tie.

For girls in grades K-7, leggings or tights may be worn underneath skirts or jumpers but must be ankle-length or footed in a solid color—grey, navy, white, or black. Leggings are not to be worn without other bottoms on top. Please note that pants worn underneath skirts or jumpers are not permissible.

For students in grades K-4 especially, we recommend (but not require) the use of belts with the khaki pants. If a student is struggling to keep the pants around the waist due to the looseness of the material, a belt would provide this additional support to tighten the waist properly.

Late Pick-Up Policy

Students are required to be picked up by 3:45 PM, unless they are participating in our after-care program or an extracurricular activity starting at 3:45 PM or earlier. Even if they have siblings in clubs or athletics, students must either be picked up or supervised outside by a parent/guardian. If a student is still on campus and not engaged in a club or athletics by 3:45 PM, the student must wait in the front office until picked up. The late fee for pick-up after 3:45 PM is \$10 for the first minute and \$1 per minute thereafter. The same late fee applies to those picking up students late from any extracurricular activity ending after 3:45 PM. If a student is picked up late on two or more occasions during the school year, they will be unenrolled from the activity.
